




Funding challenges



I understand that funding is being sought to provide a community meeting place in the church of St John the Baptist in Stadhampton and, on behalf of Age Concern Chalgrove, I would like to pledge our support for this project.

There is currently nowhere in Stadhampton where people may meet other than on the village green or in a pub and whilst this might suit some it is of little use or interest to the elderly. In Chalgrove we run a Day Centre on a Tuesday and currently transport a number of people from Stadhampton to attend.

Age Concern Chalgrove is partially funded by Oxfordshire County Council and is mandated to take the frail and elderly, the socially isolated and those receiving care, and to provide them with help and support, a fresh cooked hot meal and some entertainment. Our members, including those from Stadhampton, greatly appreciate what we have to offer with the only complaint being that we are not open more often.

A similar operation in Stadhampton would be welcomed by the elderly and indeed the NHS and Oxon County Council, as providing this facility enables and encourages the elderly to remain in their own home and look after themselves.



Learning -2


- Find the evidence, then refine it
