# 'New' Footpath at Culham - Natural England

For those walkers who haven't yet found it, there is a new footpath around the fields between the Thames Cut and Sutton Courtenay Pools. It can be accessed at the Donkey Bridge, the weir and Abingdon road in Sutton Courtenay. A map is available on the web at <a href="mailto:cwr.naturalengland.org.uk">cwr.naturalengland.org.uk</a> (NB: "cwr" not "www").

This is a 'Walks and Rides' page: once there, select OXFORDSHIRE and then ZOUCH FARM NEAR CULHAM to see complete details. Unfortunately we have neither copyright permission nor space to print the map here. The path provides a 2.9 Km (1.8 ml) circular walk around fields that have reverted from arable to grassland to reduce soil erosion by flooding (and it may be flooded during the winter!)

# **County Councillor's Report**

The Ardley incinerator scheme is going ahead and <u>WRG have submitted a plan for a Mechanical and Biological Treatment recycling facility for Sutton Courtenay.</u>

A £5m grant will allow OCC to improve the Thornhill Park and Ride by introducing 500 more spaces and improving some of the local roads.

There is a proposal to introduce London style 'Boris' bikes to Oxford.

The European School is proceeding with a proposal to become a free school.

## **District Councillor's Report**

The recycling group Verdant is now renamed Biffa.

A young Achievers grant is available from SODC, primarily aimed at sport and musical achievements. Up to £250 is available.

Various overgrown hedges have been reported to SODC.

Burial Ground fees are under consideration and will be in line with those of the Church. They will be approved at the September CPC meeting.

CPC has become a member of the Open Spaces Society.

The monkey bars at the playing field will be removed due to safey considerations.

CPC is proceeding with proposals to build a pavilion on the playing field. This was first put forward about 11 years ago. Applications for planning permission and grants are in hand. The previous drawings will be updated and will form the basis of the application.

#### **Parking**

There have been several instances recently of car parking on the Green. Please note that apart from causing damage to the area it is an offence to park on designated Village Green land. Also, please do not park across or on the village paths. Again this is an offence in law but it also prevents pedestrians' free access, often forcing them into the road to bypass the blockage. Please remember to be considerate to your fellow villagers and visitors to the area.

# **Digital TV Switchover**

We have already been warned that Oxfordshire will switch to digital-only TV in September 2011, in two stages on the **14th** and **28th**. It means that that Freeview services (digital TV through an aerial) can be extended to people who can't currently get them. Any analogue television left unconverted will be unable to receive TV programmes after the switchover. If you already have Freeview, you will need to re-tune your TV on switchover day.

However it's not quite that simple. Some parishes in South Oxfordshire will not switch to Digital until April 2012 as they receive their TV signal from London not Oxford. ORCC have tried, without success, to find out from Digital UK which parishes are affected. The only way of finding out when a postcode area switches over to digital is to go online and use the postcode checker at: <a href="https://www.digitaluk.co.uk/postcodechecker/">www.digitaluk.co.uk/postcodechecker/</a> According to this web site, Culham gets its TV from both transmitters.

ORCC (Oxfordshire Rural Community Council) will be running an advice point in Didcot to answer any questions you may have about the switchover, including re-tuning, equipment and the Switchover Help Scheme. This advice point will take place from **10 am** to **4 pm** on **14**<sup>th</sup>, **15**<sup>th</sup>, **28**<sup>th</sup> **and 29**<sup>th</sup> **September** at the Cornerstone Arts Centre, 25 Station Road, **Didcot**.

If you have a question about the switchover or what you need to do, please pop in to this advice point and they will be able to help. However, here's what we've found so far, for **CULHAM.** 

If your local BBC news service is **BBC Oxford** you get your TV from the **Oxford transmitter** in the **Central TV Region** and your switchover dates are – as above – on **14th & 28th September 2011**. If your local BBC news service is **South Today**, you get your TV from the **Hannington transmitter in the Meridian TV region** and your change-over dates are **8th and 22nd February 2012**.

Note that **ITV's local news**, for both regions, is **Meridian Tonight**. Some random checks by The Mouthpiece suggest that houses on the High Street may get their TV from either transmitter so don't assume anything!
