Fundraising for Friends of St Paul's Church – Philip Owen

There is an easy way to generate income for local charities when you make purchases on the internet without costing you anything. It is called easyfundraising.

www.easyfundraising.org.uk helps charities, schools, sports clubs, community groups, and other good causes to raise money when their supporters shop online. It works in a similar way to many other loyalty shopping sites, but instead of earning points when you shop, you raise a donation for your cause instead. It's as simple as that!

You can shop with over 2,000 well known stores and each will donate up to 15% of what you spend. For example, John Lewis will donate 1%, Amazon 2.5%, The Body Shop 6% and some insurance retailers will even donate up to £30 simply for taking out a policy with them! It doesn't cost you a penny more - the service is totally free.

<u>How to generate donations</u> It's very simple - once you've registered on the website, when you shop with one of the retailers, the easyfundraising system makes a note of the purchase, collects the donation from the retailer and passes it to your chosen good cause. That's it! No hassle for you, easyfundraising do all the hard work while you shop as you normally would.

2. Click on 'sign me up'

3. Fill out the quick form to register your details (you do not give your bank details).

- 4. Find the retailer you want to shop with.
- 5. Click to visit the retailer, then shop as you normally would.

6. Your donation will be shown in your easyfundraising account within 30 days. Please let me or anyone in the Friends' know if you need any help.

From the County Councillor: There was no report.

A 'forest school' will be created on the playing field if the Diocese agree to the lease being amended.

One of two replacement trees has been planted by the pond and the second will go in on the north west corner of the Green when the existing tree has been removed.

It is expected that more short posts will be introduced around the Green to protect the verges.

The Bridleway is looking good after the recent repairs by villagers and the introduction of the wooden posts. A smaller vehicle for the collection of wheelie bins around the Green is not available but CPC will monitor the state of repair of the Bridleway.

A fairly major clearance of a sort, of trees along the A415 north of the playing field, has been undertaken by the Diocese.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the school on 08 April at 7:30pm. Refreshments will be provided.

Parking

Parking is something that your neighbourhood officers deal with on a day to day basis and we rely on local residents to keep us informed of any issues arising. We understand that inconsiderate and illegal parking can be frustrating and dangerous and we will assess and deal with all reports appropriately. Vehicles parked illegally or causing an obstruction can be fined £30 by means of a fixed penalty notice. We have received further complaints of inconsiderate parking outside Culham School, particularly at school pick up and drop off times. We have been asked to monitor this and will issue warnings if required.

Have you signed up to Thames Valley Alert?

Thames Valley Alert is the new system for receiving crime and policing updates for your area. The stateof-the-art system allows anyone who signs up to choose what updates they receive and how they should like to receive it. A new option includes receiving information via text and more traditional landline and email messages will still be available.
