Culham Parish Council (CPC) notes - October 2013

From the County Councillor

Lorraine Lindsay-Gales' report for October has been sent for inclusion on the village website (www.culhamvillage.org.uk).

No news from the District Councillor, John Cotton.

Other items

The CPC external audit has been undertaken and has been signed off as passing all requirements.

New salt bins will be ordered for The Green and Thame Lane. OCC will fill them once each winter but it will be up to villagers to apply as necessary. The bin on The Glebe will be retained.

Under the Community Governance Review of boundaries etc , CPC will recommend that the Jet Site Parish boundary should be retained, i.e. that the site should not be assigned to any one single Parish (Culham, Clifton or Nuneham).

There has been no response from the Police or Highways regarding CPC request to discuss the village's road related problems.

The recreation ground gate has been repaired.
