#### Talking Point by Reverend Jennifer Morton, Assistant Curate in the Team

The end of September and beginning of October is the season in the Churches year when we celebrate harvest time, think about God's goodness to us and remember the work of the farmers who grow our food in the fields around us. Therefore it seems particularly appropriate, when our thoughts turn to giving thanks for what the land produces and how this might be shared with others, that, all being well, we will be welcoming visitors from South Africa who run the food project that the churches in the Dorchester Team support. This project is based in the small community of Boegoeberg in the Oxford link Diocese of Kimberly and Kuruman and undertakes to feed those preschool children who had no guaranteed meal with one good meal a week. With our support this has been extended to three meals a week. I hope that while Sarah, Susanna (Cheeks), Natalie and Theresa are here you will find an opportunity to meet with them and hear firsthand about what they are doing in their community.

Of course at this time of year we may be able to share with others surplus produce from our own gardens but for those of us not blessed with green fingers this probably means either buying groceries to donate or giving the cash. I wonder then how often we stop and think about how we spend our money. Maybe we feel we have barely enough to manage ourselves and there will have been families across this country who has struggled to feed their children during the holidays when there are no free school meals available.

Those of us who are more fortunate are able to donate to causes close to our hearts or raise money on their behalf. This includes the churches in our communities, which depend on the generosity of parishioners to keep them open. Many other organisations also depend solely on such generosity and the RNLI springs to mind. You can now play an RNLI Lottery, an interesting development, and it made me wonder whether the possibility of winning a prize was a greater incentive than just donating to a good cause. For example during the Olympics it was evident how dependent on profits from the National Lottery our successful athletes are but I am not sure if as much would have been raised directly.

Whatever our circumstances we all have choices to make when using the resources we have, financial or otherwise, and harvest time seems a good opportunity to consider these once more.

'I sat down and imagined how I'd feel if I was totally housebound. I know the importance of having literature and company in my life now I'm living alone, so I thought it's important to reach out to others who may not have much contact with the outside world. [...] It's fulfilling and very rewarding. The ladies I deliver to are keen to chat and talk about the authors and the plots.'

Your county council has launched a new campaign appealing for home library service volunteers to help less able people in their community by choosing and delivering books to those who cannot get to a library.

Who benefits? Anyone who cannot get to a library, including the elderly and many disabled people across Oxfordshire who need a volunteer to bring library services to their door. They need a friendly face that can stop by once every three weeks to bring them some new books or CDs and stop for a little chat.

**Is the home library service really so important?** Yes – the home library service brings entertainment, pleasure and human contact to people, where they may otherwise have none.

**Could you spare a little time?** Schedules can work around you and you can organise the drop off times directly with the people you deliver to, meaning you can fit it around your busy life. Expenses are reimbursed and you can do as many or as few journeys as you wish.

#### Report to Parish Councils from CLLR Lorraine Lindsay-Gale – September 2016

**SODC LOCAL PLAN CONSULTATION Culham Science Centre** The County Council's response to the Plan is lengthy. In summary with relation to this area it states: "Oxfordshire County Council supports a focus on growth within Science Vale, which is the area concentrated around the three science parks at Harwell Campus, Culham Science Centre, and Milton Park, which also include two enterprise zones and at the centre of which is Didcot. Although many of the opportunities for growth in that area have already been identified, additional growth at Culham Science Centre would help reinforce the Science Vale focus, deliver a sustainable community, deliver jobs and infrastructure to benefit the wider area. The current development proposal for Culham could be an international exemplar for sustainable communities, fit well with the emerging Didcot Garden Town and enable more success for the Science Vale." The planned new road from Didcot, the river crossing and a Clifton Hampden bypass would be viable prospects if such a vision was adopted.

OXFORDSHIRE COMET: THE NEW BOOKABLE TRANSPORT SERVICE Several communities in my Division are already taking up this new OCC service and I would encourage those who have not yet done so to investigate whether it would be a good thing for their residents too. The Oxfordshire Comet is a not for profit, bookable transport service for those who can't access suitable public transport. It can be booked for any type of trip, whether it's to meet friends in town, travel across the county, attend an appointment or pop to the shops. The service is available 10.15am - 2.30pm Monday to Friday (not Bank Holidays). It uses vehicles that normally take children to school and adults to day care centres. (OCC identified the times of the day when they weren't being used and are making them available so that residents can make the journeys they want.) Because OCC already owns these vehicles, the Council only has to cover running costs, meaning charges are low for passengers. - ■Community groups can apply for grants of £10k-£100k from the Revenue Grants scheme.
- ■The Local Plan for South Oxfordshire consultation period is now closed SODC are considering the responses.
- ■The devolution plans studies recently carried out by SODC and OCC have been published and can be found at http://www.southoxon.gov.uk/about-us/devolution.
- From 3 November, SODC will only empty green wheelie bins if the recycling in them is **loose** or in **clear sacks**. This is to help in recycling.
- ■Electric blankets will be checked free of charge in Abingdon on Thursday 06 October. Ring 01865 815000 (option4) or email communityengagement@oxfordshire.gov.uk or an appointment.

#### **CPC** matters

- ■From Morrells A planning pre-application for the Waggon and Horses has been submitted to SODC.
- ■There is no clear completion date for the works on the Sutton weir but feed in tariff surveys are expected at the end of September.
- ■The church (St Pauls) will be investigated as a possible venue for future polling station use.
- ■A report on road safety at the school in Thame Lane is to be chased up.
- ■A Christmas tree for the Green will be ordered soon. A plan for future tree planting around the village will be instigated.
- ■Village grass cutting and its funding by CPC will be discussed at the next meeting.
- ■The Culham Community Building voting has completed. A meeting of the sub-committee will assess the results.
- ■Culham Show 2016 is in progress for Saturday 24 September.
- ■A gate from the lock car park to the lock is being pursued with the Environment Agency for their thoughts.
- ■The village bus service times have changed recently, again. Please check the latest timetables.
