## Culham Parish Council (CPC) – March 2019

There is some confusion amongst the authorities as to what is to happen to the spoil heaps left over from the hydro build. CPC will write to OCC, EA and SODC about getting a resolution. Either spread the waste on the fields or remove it from site.

There were 84 responses to the 152 questionnaires sent out about the Waggon and Horses site development. Of those 75% showed support for the application.

There are local elections being held 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019. This includes Culham Parish Council. If you wish to be nominated for a position on the CPC please see the item elsewhere in the Mouthpiece.

A reduced spec for the fence across the playing field has been accepted by the Diocese. Quotes will now be sought for the installation of a replacement fence.

The SCGB group are to begin fund raising for the campaign against the new town proposed for the area north of the A415. Several cash donations have been received.

Letters sent and received by CPC about the Cambridge Expressway will be placed on the CPC website.

CPC will object to the latest application for a 'farm park' on Culham Hill.

CPC will object to the application at the JET site for an extension to the RACE building on the basis that this will encourage more cars to the site, given that the application includes a car park extension.

One quote out of three requests sent out has been received for the grass cutting contract. Three grass cuts have been requested for late April, June and September with a possible fourth in late July depending on the rate of growth.

CPC will support the application by Appleford PC for a Sunday service at Culham rail station.

## **6 Vacancies for Parish Councillors – Culham Parish Council**

On 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019 there will be elections for the Parish Council.

To be eligible to apply to be a councillor you need to be over 18, preferably a resident of the Parish of Culham and be on the electoral roll (although exceptions do apply).

As part of the Parish Council you will have responsibility on deciding how much to raise through the council tax, influencing and shaping the long-term development policy for the Parish and as part of the Planning process comment on planning applications in the Parish. The main meetings are held once a month, in the evenings.

Locally we are going through busy times with proposals for a housing development on the Green Belt, an Adventure Park, a Quarry, proposal for an Oxford to Cambridge expressway road and proposed enlargement of Didcot. If you are interested in local issues and matters that affect Culham and wish to improve the quality of life and the environment in the local area then consider standing as a candidate for the Parish Council.

Oxfordshire Fire & Rescue Service are looking for on-call Firefighters to join their team!

Do you want to earn extra money, serve your community and save lives in a rewarding role? If so, a career as an On-call Firefighter might be just the thing for you.

On-call Firefighters are the backbone of the fire service and anyone can be one. If you're employed full-time, are a parent, out of employment or just have some spare time, you can respond to emergency calls.

On-call Firefighters are trained and paid for their time and service - and on average are expected to be called out two or three times each week for about an hour at a time - this can be at night or during the day.

They are looking for anyone over the age of 18, who is physically fit (this can be worked on), doesn't suffer from vertigo, claustrophobia or dislike the sight of blood. They need good common sense, to be enthusiastic, reliable and honest.

#### **Oxfordshire's Citizen Science WaterBlitz**

The 8th Thames WaterBlitz will take place on 26th to 29th April 2109. This bi-annual Citizen Science event, first launched in September 2015, involves hundreds of volunteers carrying out quick and easy to use tests for phosphates and nitrates in local ponds, lakes, ditches, springs, streams and rivers. The intensive testing done by volunteers can help identify key pollution sources or clean water spots that act as refuges for some of our special wildlife that's more sensitive to water quality, such as the beautiful but rare fen violet.

Registration is now open for the next Thames WaterBlitz between the 26th and 29th of April. Please follow the steps on this video to register for the event and request your free Freshwater Watch kit <u>https://ewgis.org/waterblitz-registration/</u>. Don't forgot to register before 21st April to allow time for testing kits to be posted.
